PUBLIC,
PERSISTENT,
PERMANENT

When you post anything on the Internet, it is **public**, permanent and persistent.

- This means that what you post online may not go away even if you hit delete. Someone may have already copied it.
- Consider anything you post on the internet public. Just because you use privacy settings does not mean that your post cannot be shared to someone else. Think about what you are posting. Is it true, kind, and helpful?
- Your Learn60 account is not a personal account and should be shared with your parents.

FOOTPRINTS IN THE SAND ARE DIFFERENT THAN ONLINE DIGITAL FOOTPRINTS



- Footprints in the sand can be erased but digital footprints are permanent.

- This means that when you write and post something online it is like using permanent ink on paper versus using pencil that can be erased.

PAUSE BEFORE YOU POST!

Is your post kind, true and helpful? The post will still be there in future years.





You need to ask permission from others to post personal information about them. You are not to post personal information of or about others online using Learn60 accounts or tools.



Ask permission before you take pictures or video of others. Speak up if others take your image without permission.

PERMISSION FROM OTHERS



Learn6o accounts and Google Apps for Education tools are used for schoolwork only. Do not use them for personal conversations or uses.



You have a Learn6o Drive to save your schoolwork that will move with you from grade to grade.
